

Helping Each Other Out: Fairy House Tour Natural Material Donations Needed

On September 23 & 24, the Friends of the South End (FOSE) annual Fairy House Tour will return to Portsmouth. The charity event attracts thousands of attendees and the proceeds benefit local schools and participating nonprofit organizations.

FOSE depends on the kindness and generosity of local volunteers to put on the event, which includes a "make it and take it" station. The event organizers are looking for donations of natural materials to supply the craft stations.

As you do your fall garden clean-ups, please collect for donation flower cuttings, sticks, leaves, branches, pinecones, acorns, and evergreens that you would otherwise discard.

Materials should be placed in a brown paper leaf/lawn bag, a garbage bag, or a bin (that you don't need returned) and dropped off at Strawbery Banke's "dumpster lot" on Washington Street in the labeled receptacle. Donations are being accepted September 1-23.
